Tools for effective listening	The passage—Matthew 18:21-35
Whether we're listening to our friends, our families, our employers, or our Bibles, the following tools will help us:	Forgiving from the heart
1. Immediate Context: Stop interrupting me! Hear my whole thought! 1a. Get the big picture.	Jesus tells His disciples to forgive from their hearts or face serious consequences.
1b. Find the important details.	The important details are related to the main point: (1) Comparison to financial debt. (2) The forgiven one refuses to forgive. (3) Result: condemned to prison. (4) God will treat you like that servant.
1c. Unmask our assumptions.	Earthly prison or eternal punishment?
2. Translations: Could you say that again using different words?	10,000 talents = 10,000 bags of gold 100 denarii = 100 silver coins
3. Footnotes and commentaries: Mary, help me understand what John just said.	100 denarii = 100 days of wages
4. Book context: Oops! Sorry. I forgot what you told me this morning.	Language: hell, fire of hell, eternal fire, eternal punishment, weeping and gnashing of teeth
5. Whole Bible context: If only I had paid attention to what you said last week.	Related passages on forgiveness. (For examples, see optional sheet of sermon notes.)
6. Setting: I understand you so much better, now that I know the setting of your life.	
7. Figurative language: The way you talk enriches my life. Examples: metaphor, irony, symbolism	
8. Genres: The "color" in your language helps me understand you better. Examples: humor, proverbs, prophecy, parables Hebrew poetry, word pictures	Deptional: See sheet of sermon notes. (available after the service)
9. Word study: You just used a word I thought I understood, but	
10. Application: Finally, I know what to do. (action, attitude, belief, etc.)	Pick up the application sheet, after the service.
